

# Cookie Policy

This Cookie Policy explains what cookies are and how and why they may be stored on and accessed from your device when you use or visit any website or app that posts a link to this Policy (“Sites”). This Cookie Policy should be read together with our Privacy Policy and the Firm’s Legal Notices and Terms of Use.

## **What are cookies?**

A cookie is a small piece of data that can be stored on and accessed from your browser or device when you visit a website. A cookie can be a “persistent cookie” or a “session cookie.” Session cookies are automatically removed from your device after you close your browser. Persistent cookies remain on your device until they expire, even after you close your browser. Cookies help keep a record of your visit to a website and are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently. ## **How do our Sites use cookies?**

We use cookies to keep a record of your visits to our Sites so that we can provide you with a good browsing experience, respond to your requests, understand usage and improve the Sites, and protect the Sites. We use both persistent cookies and session cookies. These cookies include both first-party cookies set by us, and third-party cookies set by third-party providers whose services we have added to the Sites.

Please note that if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including strictly necessary cookies) you may not be able to access or use all or parts or functionalities of our Sites.

Most browsers also allow you to view websites in "private mode", which deletes cookies after you visit the site. To learn more about activating "private mode", please read the help section of your browser. You can still visit our Sites if your browser is in "private mode", but the user experience may not be optimal and some functions may not work.

If you want to remove previously stored cookies, you can manually delete the cookies at any time. However, this will not prevent our Sites from placing further cookies on your device unless and until you adjust your Internet browser setting or your consent selection in the Cookie Settings as described above.
