In this article, Jenner & Block Partner Robert J. Dalling explains that the EU/UK December 2020 trade and cooperation deal has limited the consequences of Brexit in terms of UK investigations. “The impact on cooperation between UK and EU law enforcement agencies would clearly have been much more dramatic in the event of a no-deal Brexit,” he observes, adding, “Many of the key tools available pre-Brexit to a UK law enforcement agency investigating corruption allegations will remain at their disposal, even though the formal mechanisms have changed, and even though turnaround times may suffer.”
