H&M Hennes & Mauritz, L.P.* The Court held 6-3 that a copyright registrant’s lack of knowledge of errors of either law or fact can excuse inaccurate statements in a registration application and the resulting registration. The authors give background on the case and its implications for copyright owners. “By limiting the potential grounds to challenge the validity of a copyright registration, the Court’s opinion provides valuable protection to all copyright owners,” they observe.
