Earlier in her career, Emily served as an Associate Counsel in the Office of the White House Counsel, where she advised senior White House and Executive Branch agency officials on high-priority litigation and congressional and other investigations, managing risk on a variety of policy initiatives. Before joining the Office of the White House Counsel, Emily served in several roles in the Civil Rights Division of the Department of Justice, including as Senior Counselor and Acting Chief of Staff. In 2012, Emily served as a special assistant US attorney in the Eastern District of Virginia, where she prosecuted federal drug and wire fraud cases.
