

“What Wis. Anti-Assignment Ruling Means For Policyholders,” *Law360*

In an article for *Law360*, Partner Brian S. Scarbrough and Summer Associate Daniel Ergas discussed Wisconsin’s anti-assignment ruling and its effect on policyholders. They reference *Pepsi-Cola Metropolitan Bottling Co. v. Employers Insurance Co.*, noting that the decision aligns Wisconsin with the majority of jurisdictions that “do not enforce anti-assignment contractual language when the assignment is made post-loss.” They also write, “policyholders subject to an anti-assignment clause should take care to consider these issues of judicial construction, rather than relying on the plain contractual language alone.”
