In their article for *Lawfare*, Jenner & Block Partner Brandon Fox, Special Counsel Erica Sedler, and Associate Rachael Goldman discuss the appropriate venue for the Justice Department, should it bring charges against former President Trump regarding his alleged possession of classified documents at his Mar-a-Lago residence. The authors respond to an earlier article that questions whether venue in DC would be proper. In their analysis, they observe that there are many criminal statutes that would provide venue in DC, but that the “bigger issue in the venue discussion should be one of policy, not law.”
